#### From the Preacherman....

In the movie *Network*, winner of four Academy Awards in 1976, Howard Beale is the longtime anchor of a television evening news program in New York City. Beale, played by Peter Finch, is depicted as increasingly angry and unhinged, until he finally begins to shout on camera during a program, "I'm as mad as hell and I'm not going to take this anymore!" As Beale repeats himself, he invites others to join him in yelling the phrase aloud. And slowly, people all around the city fling open their windows and shout aloud their convictions of anger, frustration and disappointment.

But that's just a movie, right? Well, it is a good movie, a top 100 all-time movie, so maybe it's on to something. Perhaps we think the only alternative to calm discussion and discourse is violence and intimidation. What if there is another way, a way expressed right there before us in plain sight in the Psalms?

I am speaking, of course, about the Psalms of Lament, those rough, raw and honest words of faith right in the middle of our Bibles. Haven't listened to them in a while? Try Psalm 130: *Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!* (v.1) That speech is direct and honest to God, unvarnished by language of supplication and respect. But just how forthright can a psalm be, eh? Well, have you read Psalm 137 lately? Go ahead and do that. All of it. I will wait....?....go ahead....yeah, it's that bad. Awful.

What can make someone so angry as to wish for the death of the child of an enemy? That's horrible and unthinkable, right? We are taught to swallow such things in the presence of our faith and in polite company. But what if we did what the psalmist does? What if we took our anger and frustrations and despair and, instead of swallowing them or acting on them towards others, what if we gave them to God in prayer? Just angry, heartfelt, heart-rending, fist-shaking anger given to God in prayer?

What am I getting at? I am sick and tired of being sick and tired, of preaching to six people in the sanctuary on Sundays, of being worried about every sneeze, of friends getting sick and dying, of this awful disease and the slow vaccine and everything. Everything! I am frustrated and angry and depressed and at times even disconsolate. That is as honest as I can be with you. Question is, am I this honest with God? I better be. So should you.


