Dear FCC Legacy Fund,

On behalf of the Community Dental Clinic, we thank you for your grant of \$3,000 for the dental clinic. Our non-profit clinic has served the Daviess County community since August, 2009. We have served over 15,130 patients and greatly reduced visits to the local Emergency Department related to tooth pain. Also, we educated and screened 1,156 children at 10 local schools during the 2019-20 school year. We have a special emphasis on serving the dental needs of disadvantaged children in our community.

We have numerous patients eligible for care. Unfortunately, many of these patients are very ill. We now take the blood pressure of our adult patients before treating and refer the patient to a primary care physician, if needed. At our clinic, we are treating both dental and overall health with the goal of improved health for our community and its residents. In the past year, we provided over \$1 million of care. By improving dental care, one person at a time, the health of the community improves. Thanks to the help of generous donors like FCC, we significantly impact and improve oral healthcare in our community. Thank you!


