#### From the Preacherman....

If you want to see America, get off the interstate. You can get there faster by 4-lane, but the real stories are on the side roads. Take US 17 along the coast if you want to see genuine Georgia low country. If you want to see Kentucky's bluegrass, travel Highway 60 from Lexington to Louisville. Interstate 81 will take you quickly through the Shenandoah Valley, but Highway 11 is old Virginia. The question is one of journey versus destination. If getting there is what matters, then, by all means, take the fastest route. Sometimes, however, the journey is the destination, and the fastest route won't get you there at all.

Holy Week always presents us with a challenge: How do we get through it? The direct way is fastest: from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, skipping the rough side roads. People want to get to the good news of resurrection and eternal life as fast as they can, which is understandable. Life can be a struggle, even on the best days. Why focus so much attention on the hard stuff? Optimism and positive thinking are desperately needed in our world today; hope is in short supply.

But Easter without the Passion of Jesus is no hope at all. The side roads are not superfluous; indeed, they are the destination of Jesus' life: the Last Supper and upper room discourse with disciples; the test of faith in Gethsemane; arrest and trial before Roman officials; beatings and death on a cross. It is tempting to skip from Christmas to Palms to the glory of Easter. Nobody wants to watch someone else suffer and die, especially when there are direct implications for those who follow. Jesus' own disciples failed to make the journey with him to Good Friday. Why should we be any different? We aren't, but are called to try anyway.

Take the journey of Holy Week, the whole blessed thing, from the hallelujahs of hailing palms, to the depths of desertion and death, to the heights of resurrection glory. The whole trip is necessary for any of it to make sense. Easter without the cross is cheap grace, forgiveness without repentance, life without the threat of death, a lie. The cross without Easter is a sad, sick joke on a good man, mistaken in his faith in God. But together? Together they form the greatest story ever told, so pay attention to all of it this year. Watch. Follow. Weep tears of sorrow and of joy. You cannot get to Easter too quickly. Get off the interstate.
