From the Preacherman....

I usually have a decent idea for something to write when I come to this space, a few paragraphs that seem to cohere and form a complete idea. I'm not sure how things fit together today, though, so I will tell you what is on my mind and let you decide...

First, for nearly a year and a half the health concerns of Jackson Roark have compelled our prayers and attention. Jackson, 13 years old, has valiantly battled cancer, with all of its concurrent treatments and surgery. We have attempted in numerous ways to support him and his family. Recently the question arose: How can we help now? Thus, the church, all of us, whoever that may be, wherever you are, will take up a monetary collection to help his family. It is cold hard cash with a giant dose of our love and compassion. We ask today a simple, prayerful question: What can you give to help Jackson? Send it to the church (700 JR Miller Blvd, Owensboro, KY 42303) and we will give it to them. It is what we can do right now to help.

Second, Anne Carlisle is retiring as our church secretary at the end of May. She has served nearly 15 years in this capacity with, get this, 4 Senior Ministers, 5 Interim Ministers, 2 Associate Ministers and 1 Fire. Let that sink in for a moment. The one constant at church through nearly fifteen years of near constant change-and THE FIRE- has been Anne Carlisle. Preachers can come and go, but not Anne. Well, now Anne is going, with all the words of thanksgiving, gratitude and blessing that we can muster. She doesn't want any fanfare or public recognition, and I ask you to respect those wishes, but your quiet expressions of appreciation are welcome. She deserves them.

So, how are these things related? They reveal a simple but essential aspect of the gospel. God calls us to love in particular, not in general. I am called to love you, in this place and time in history, not as I wish it was, but as things are. And you are called to love me. Period. Full stop.

The gospel is true, not because it is universal, but because it is particular and peculiar, odd and strange. Love the people in your midst who need it and want it, and those who don't. Love your church and those who serve in it. Love this world in all of its joy and pain, its sorrow and celebration. This is the gospel in all of its fullness. And oddness. I love this gospel and what it calls me to. Do you?
