From the Preacherman....

Of late my attention has been captured by a little noticed, but profoundly important theme in Scripture that speaks to our 21st Century existence. People are busy, that goes without saying, but many are struggling to get any sense of the presence and activity of God in the world. There seems little time and less space to breathe in the life of God, so we rush through our harried days until we fall exhausted into bed at night, wondering what exactly we accomplished with all that busyness. As a pastor I talk to person after person whose greatest need is space, peace and time to do more than catch a breath. How does the church help?

Not by adding to your busyness, but first encouraging us to listen....

"Be still and know that I am God (Ps. 46:10)....Deep calls to deep (Ps. 42:7)....the blessings of the deep that lies beneath (Gen. 49:25)... Can you find out the deep things of God? (Job 11:7)....Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch (Luke 5:4)."

If you had asked me twenty-five years ago what kind of church I wanted to serve, I probably would have told you a busy church, active in ministry, missions and service to God and neighbor. Today I will tell you that I want to serve a deep church, to serve beside people who are growing ever deeper in their faith, not by being overly busy, but by understanding our human limits, resting in the grace of a merciful God and inviting others to share in that peace. A deep life of faith is an active life, but the energy is God's life flowing through us. There is faith and trust in God's power to bless and expand our efforts, not in our own, limited human resources.

God invites us to participate in the in-breaking reign of the Almighty in this world, the reign of God that is among us. God welcomes us to take part in that, but God can do all of it without us. You do know that, right? There are no indispensible people in the world. We don't have to participate in any of it. We get to join in, not because we must, but because we may.

I am convinced that there are many people in our community who want to go deeper in their faith. Not busier, but deeper. The church can offer that. Perhaps the church must offer that in this day and age. Be still and know that God is God. Indeed.
