From the Preacherman....

Among the characteristics people most admire in others is the ability to make up one's mind, to decide on a course of action and to stick with it, no matter what. Changing one's mind is often referred to as "flip-flopping," and is never applied with admiration and respect. Such behavior seems to indicate an inability to follow through and stick to one's principles. We like people who can make a decision, be resolute and refuse to waver from the chosen course.

Often, people go to the Bible with the idea that the Scriptures will give strength and support for making such decisions and sticking with them. Countless millions have found the Bible to be life-giving sustenance in the midst of dark and difficult days. The enduring power of the Scriptures to sustain and inspire is evident generation after generation.

However, the Bible also exists to change our minds, to rattle our comfortable cages and to unhinge us from our relaxed conditions. In worship we have been listening to some of the most familiar, and comforting, texts in the Bible, parables of Jesus in Luke's Gospel. Among our parables are stories about a sower of seeds, a good Samaritan, a prodigal son, po' Lazarus and a mustard seed.

Teaching in parables was one of the distinctive features of Jesus' ministry. We miss that in our mad scramble to the cross and Easter. Getting to heaven often seems to be the only thing on the church's mind some days. But Jesus had other things in mind. He was dealing with people who had made up their minds about God. Things were settled, set in stone and unchanging. The faithful person's task was to do what had always been done, believe what had always been taught and pass that on to the next generation.

Into this settled world came Jesus teaching in parables. Parables are the great un-deciders of the Bible. Whatever you think you know, whatever you are certain about and have bet your life on, parables will make you reconsider, change your mind and -God forbid-perhaps even force you to flip-flop on an important subject. Parables are spoken in order to open up the world to a mystery, to make us less certain of our own decisions so that we might have to place more trust in God, following by faith and not by sight.

The God of the parables is wild, risky, gracious and demanding; not unlike God in the rest of the Bible, but very unlike what most people want. So, don't decide. Wait. Listen. Behold, I will tell you a mystery....
