## From the Preacherman....

When Walter Cronkite died, we saw the passing of an icon of television history. He reported the nightly news for millions of viewers, struggled openly when John F. Kennedy was shot, told the truth about Vietnam and Watergate, and was the voice of the voyage to the moon. When he concluded the nightly news with his signature phrase "*And that's the way it is....*" we generally felt that, yes that **is** the way it is tonight. The idea that one voice, one man, could speak for a nation was a remarkable thing for me to believe in as a young man growing up in this country.

And it was also wrong. Cronkite would agree with me, I think: no individual can speak for everyone else. It may be difficult for us to accept this, especially if we long for a time and place that is not so fractured and splintered, as is America today. When Cronkite pronounced "*And that's the way it is....*" we presumed a level of objectivity in reporting that, in truth, didn't exist then, and certainly doesn't now. Cronkite didn't have an agenda, didn't need to have great hair and tried simply to report the news, but contradictions kept cropping up.

He bucked the company line on Vietnam, going there in person to see the truth for himself and contradicting official government reports about progress. He gave credence to early reporting about the outrages of Watergate when most people were dismissing them. It was Cronkite who gave voice to an alternative reading of events, while we as a nation were awakened to the need for civil rights for African-Americans and equal rights for women. The cacophony of voices that now clamor to be heard in our democracy were given impetus and encouragement by a man whose signature statement seemed to indicate that one voice could summarize everything. If that isn't irony, I don't know what is.

Why bring this up? Because Walter Cronkite was a Christian, a man who lived out his faith in his public as well as his private life. In the pursuit of truth in reporting, he uncovered some very unsavory and troubling aspects of our life as a nation, things we didn't want to know, but were called to confront as a people who should repent and aim higher. He told us the truth when it would have been easier to go with the flow and not cause trouble. I think history belongs to the troublemakers, people who believe truth, justice and virtue aren't mere words, but a lifestyle. A certain 1st Century Jewish prophet preached that as well. They killed him for it. And that's the way it is....

## Make a Difference in a Child's Life


