From the Preacherman....

I was reading a memoir of one of our best poets, Donald Hall, when I stumbled across a line that unsettled me. Hall writes.

Where I sit today, working at my desk, there are shelves behind me that are dense with abandoned or unfinished work.... Behind my neck roosts a rookery of bad manuscripts. To write as much as I have done, I have needed often to fail.

(pg. 136, Unpacking the Boxes)

It was that last line that staggered me: "To write as much as I have done, I have needed often to fail." I knew immediately the profound truth of Hall's words. Every week I write pages and pages of notes and ideas for the sermon, and much of it is worthless, never to be seen again. I have boxes of sermon manuscripts that will forever remain unspoken. I preached some really bad sermons in my early years as a preacher, and fully expect more. Failure is not only probable, it is predictable.

All of that failed writing is simply part of the process that brings to the surface words that are truly worthy to be voiced by the poet or the preacher. Failure is one of the chief side-effects of innovation, creativity and hard work. Thomas Edison failed thousands of times to create the light bulb before he found the right combination of elements. Creative genius is often nothing more than the ability to learn from every mistake, every failed attempt, and keep trying.

We need often to fail. The culture around us does not value that and neither does the church very much. Perhaps it is the moral stigma that religion attaches to failure that dampens our innovative impulses. It could be the mistaken belief that church should primarily set limits on behavior to keep us in line. Our inclination to celebrate winners creates an aversion to risk-taking as an essential element of the gospel. Plain old pride keeps us from admitting failure and owning responsibility, thus limiting the teaching prospects of failure.

The fact of the matter is, Jesus failed a lot. He did not heal everyone, did not change every person, and could not convince all people of his identity. His death is, in part, the failure of his ministry. God fails, extravagantly, casting love upon this world, as a sower casts seed, and we mostly ignore it. It is the nature of the gospel to have failure as a built-in ingredient, because grace is abundant in the heart of our God. So don't be stingy with your love, your compassion or your mercy just because it will just go unnoticed or unheeded or fail to bear fruit. If you plan to follow the risky way of Jesus Christ, we need often to fail.

RETURN TO WORSHIP PLAN

First Christian Church has committed to following recommendations by <u>Healthy at Church – Christian Church Disciples of Christ in Kentucky</u>). **Return to worship date will be determined after a steady decline and no local spikes in Covid-19 cases in the two weeks leading up to tentative start date**. The Task Force and Ministerial staff reserve the right to cancel services due to local/regional Covid-19 spikes and/or consistent increases in order to protect members and guests.

• Masks - As a sign of respect for each other and to protect staff and every member of our church family, *ALL* worship attendees over the age of 3 are *required* to wear a mask while in the church building.

• Chancel Area

- Worship leaders (Ministers, Lay Leader, Musicians) only will be allowed in the chancel area and will be appropriately physically distanced
- Vocalists and those playing wind instruments will be 10 feet away from others when performing, unless living in the same household
- Hand sanitizer will be available in Chancel area
- Choir No choir at this time.
- **Singing -** Singing is-temporarily suspended except from the Chancel by the Music Minister and/or invited vocalists

• Sanctuary Seating

- The Task Force is recommending no more than 60 people (approximately 25% of capacity) in the Sanctuary
- To maintain physical distancing, worshippers will be seated by ushers
- Families who wish to return to worship will do so alphabetically according to the following schedule, beginning with a six-week rotation.

<u>Six Sunday Rotation Schedule:</u> Group #1: A-6, B-50, I-5 = 61 members

Group #2: C-32, D-11, E-7, T-10 = 60 members

Group #3: F-21, G-24, J-14 = 59 members

Group #4: H-26, K-7, L-21, N-5 = 59 members

Group #5: M-27, O-2, P-3, Q-5, S-23 = 60 members

Group #6: R-27, V-2, W-23, Y-9, Z-4 = 65 members

• Health & Safety

- o Attendees are encouraged to take temperatures before leaving home
 - Those with temperatures above 100.5 must not enter the building
 - Temperatures may be checked at the door
- Those who have been exposed to someone diagnosed with Covid-19 within the past 14 days or anyone with following symptoms may not enter the building: coughing, shortness of breath, sneezing, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, loss of taste and/or smell and/or other symptoms as identified by healthcare professionals as indicating Covid-19.
- o Attendees are expected to sanitize hands from stations in the lobby before entering the sanctuary.
- o Attendees are encouraged to use restroom at home before heading to church. Restrooms available for emergencies.
- Water fountains will be turned off.

• Entrance and Egress

- Please arrive early to guarantee physical distancing seating
- o Entrance and Egress doors will be designated
- o For contract tracing purposes, a record will be kept of everyone entering the building; method TBD
- o Allow at least 6 feet between family groups while entering and exiting
- At the conclusion of the service, ushers will control congregational exit one row at a time. Those in the Chancel area will dismiss last
- o Please maintain appropriate physical distancing after exiting the building

Communion

- o Those who prepare Communion will wear a mask and gloves.
- Communion will be conducted during the regular portion of the worship with the exception of consuming the elements. Prepackaged Communion elements may be picked up outside the Sanctuary after the service and consumed after exiting the building.
- Communion and program waste will be placed in containers by worshipers as they exit the building. Please do NOT leave your waste in the building.
- The Order of Worship Worship bulletins will be placed in seats before the service or handed out upon arrival.

Offering

- Congregation is encouraged to contribute offering via online giving or paper check through the mail (please do NOT lick envelope!)
- A donation basket will be placed near the Sanctuary exit doors for cash or checks; please place donation in the basket as you leave the sanctuary.

Additional Notes

At this time, there will be no Sunday School, Worship & Wonder, Nursery or Fellowship.

As the state of Kentucky analyzes the level of the Covid-19 virus (up or down) after more openings in the upcoming months, the Task Force will reconvene and determine how to proceed on a consistent basis until we determine our New Normal.
