#### From the Preacherman....

I received my first invitation to a Christmas party last month. The calendar is already starting to fill up. Excitement is beginning to build, but sometimes it feels like I am about to be caught up in the flow of a raging river approaching flood stage. I am standing on the bank, watching the torrent of water scream by, wondering just how I am to navigate December again this year.

It's time to make some choices, right now, about how we are going to celebrate the holidays this year. You can choose. You really can. You can decide to say "yes" to some things and say "no" to others, so that Thanksgiving is a day of gratitude, Advent a season of anticipation and Christmas a season of wonder. You can choose; in fact, you *have* to choose or someone will choose for you. What kind of holidays are you preparing to enjoy?

What each of us knows, from the youngest to the oldest, is that there is a gift, a blessing, to experience and receive from the holy days ahead. It is a gift spoken of very early in Scripture when Jacob offers a prayer for his sons, saying that the Almighty "will bless you with blessings of heaven above, blessings of the deep that lies beneath" (Gen. 49:25). The blessings of the deep that lies beneath cannot be discovered by worshiping at the altar of productivity. The deep that lies beneath has nothing to do with our busyness or effort, a full calendar and an avalanche of gifts. The deep blessings of God are received and experienced by those who are able to be present in each moment, to be still and know that God is God.

We have to decide to push back against the shallow materialism and consumerism of our culture and choose something different. We have to choose to journey deeper into the mysteries of God as revealed in Jesus of Nazareth. We have to choose to find time to be grateful at Thanksgiving, to prepare and anticipate during Advent, and to welcome the birth of the Christ into the world at Christmas. We have to choose or we will miss it because we are too busy to notice.

So, choose today what you are going to do, how you will spend your time and where your best energy will go. Learn to say "no" to some things, even good things, because it would further clutter your schedule and demand more than you can give. Find ways to be still and listen for God to speak in the silence of things. Discover the blessings of the deep that lies beneath.
