#### From the Preacherman....

What is the best Christmas you ever had? Perhaps you got a favorite toy or all of the family made it home or maybe someone surprising showed up at the last minute. We all have stories of favorites. But how about this: What is your most memorable Christmas? That changes the equation, doesn't it? I'll tell you what I think. Our most memorable Christmas comes when times are tough.

In the mid-1970's my father was in seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. I didn't know how tight finances were, but we were told before Christmas that Santa's gifts that year might be a little light. I remember waking on Christmas morning to find that my brothers and I had received a dozen or so model airplanes to build, with glue and paint included. We crafted to our hearts' content, then got my parents to hang those planes from the ceiling of our bedroom. I have had some joyful Christmas celebrations, but I remember that one from my childhood more than any other.

Odd, isn't it, that we remember with clarity the times of struggle. Seasons of our lives come and go, but suddenly there is a change, a loss, a health problem, the death of a loved one, a struggle of calamitous proportions, and time slows to a crawl, every conversation and interaction memorable and noteworthy. We remember the details of that time better than we can recall lunch yesterday or a friend's birthday.

But isn't that true of Scripture? There are two primary stories in the Hebrew Bible: the Exodus and the Exile, each seared into the memory of ancient Israel, remembered for terrible struggle and the God who met them there. The New Testament is the same. In the fullness of time, under oppressive Roman rule, Jesus was born, not in an upbeat and happy period, but in the difficulty and darkness of repression and persecution. Then, Jesus was born, not to tinsel and bright lights, carols and gingerbread, but in the midst of discord and desolation.

So I ask you, will this be a Christmas we remember? Not because we have all the things we think are necessary, but because life is hard and different, a struggle in multiple ways. Maybe this explains why Jesus would be called "Emmanuel, God with us." When people needed a sign of God's presence in the struggle, Christ was born.
