From the Preacherman....

Like most of you, I possess a veritable plethora of devices that help me keep time. I own several wristwatches that I wear for different occasions. My cell phone serves as my alarm clock in the morning. There are clocks on my microwave and stove, in my vehicle and on the walls of my home. When I was a distance runner I had a clock that ticked in my head telling me how fast I ran that last mile. As a preacher that same clock tells me when it's time to make the turn for home and finish the sermon. Yawns have a similar effect.

Each of these clocks helps me to keep time according to a schedule of events that must start and end as anticipated. There are ways to stretch time, but you pay for it later. Stay up past your bedtime to catch the end of the game and you will feel it tomorrow. Try to squeeze in another stop on the way home from work and dinner is late, the kids are cranky and the whole evening is off. Despite everything we say about needing more money, it is the lack of time that causes so much stress in our lives. You can always make more money, but time? Where do you get more of that?

So we come to Christmas, worn down by schedules and commitments and trying to squeeze too much holiday spirit into a finite amount of time, and we forget that the birth of Jesus is the invitation to keep time according to a different standard of measure. No, I don't mean the shift in calendars from B.C., Before Christ, to A.D., *Anno Domini*, In the Year of Our Lord. I mean something deeper and more profound and more hopeful than a mere human construct like a calendar which marks time chronologically.

The birth of Jesus announces the advent of the fullness of time, *kairos*, God's time. It is an event that we desperately need to observe each year, because it resets our priorities and demands that we pay more attention to God's reign among us, keeping time in a different way. It allows us to celebrate life after that chronological marker, Death, because the gift of God in Jesus is life everlasting. We are invited to participate in loving service that we will never finish, because anything worth doing takes more than a lifetime to complete; thus, we live by faith, and not by the clock on the wall.

Christmas comes each year, regular as clockwork. But Christmas really came only once, and forever changed the ways we measure, value and mark time. Eternity lived and walked among us. Still does. Nothing has ever been the same since.
