From the Preacherman....

The year 1905 is called the year of miracles, annus mirabilis, when Albert Einstein published four scientific theories that radically changed the way we see the universe. How we measure space, time, light and matter all changed with these theories. If you are reading this on a computer or cell phone, thank Einstein. He deserves the credit.

To draw an inexact parallel, this is our year of horribleness, our annus horribilis. The year is merely a third gone and we have had eight funerals at church. We have buried friends and acquaintances, loved ones and fellow disciples. We shall miss every one of them as their passing leaves our lives with great, gaping wounds. Like you, I am weary of death and dying, bone tired as they say.

We are in a season of quiet grief. Our culture urges us to quickly move on from loss. Perhaps we used to be better at understanding the long period grieving takes. Don't believe anyone who tells you to feel better because your loved one is in heaven now. Because that person is not here, we grieve, perhaps for a long time, perhaps our whole lives. I keep dates in my head and heart, dates that matter because someone I love is no longer here for me to embrace.

I am grateful for the wonderful gift of presence that my church has given to people who have lost much. Maybe you cooked something or made a phone call or showed up for a funeral or prayed without ceasing. Your presence matters more than you know, so spend your energy and existence on those things which matter: people and relationships rather than stuff and things. And dig in for a long haul. Grief takes time and we will take all the time and energy demanded of faithfully grieving the people we have lost.

All of this makes me grateful for the Christian calendar. We are deep in the season of Lent. Holy Week and Easter are on the horizon of April, but not yet. Not yet. Still, we travel with Jesus to Jerusalem and his final confrontation with suffocating religion and stifling politics. Can't we just move to the end of the story? Can't we simply skip the hard stuff and get to resurrection, Easter and the hope of life beyond the grave?

It would be nice, really, it would. But that would ignore the gift of hard days and deep losses. Gift, I say? How can such things be a gift? Because the good news of Jesus Christ reveals God's presence not merely in the best of things, but also the worst, maybe especially the worst, in suffering and in death, pain and desolation. That is the great good news of the Christian gospel. In his own annus horribilis, Jesus revealed God's love and kindness, God's fearless purpose, in the worst of days, Good Friday, and in the best of days, Easter Sunday.

Yes, he went instead of us, all our sins and pains to bear, but he also went ahead of us, pointing out the presence of God in the darkest of places, even a cross. Take your time and pay attention. It matters.
