From the Preacherman....

Jackson Roark has died. He was 13 years old. He was smart, funny, articulate, impatient with simple things and intrigued by the complex. He loved his family, his parents, his pets, and even his sister, which is hard for all boys, I should know. I had the opportunity to talk with Jackson many times and was always amazed and thankful for his questions. He asked about God, faith, what comes next and his pets. He asked good questions, ones that are not always voiced, ones without easy answers, some with no answers at all. He blessed me with that.

Jackson's friends have watched him struggle heroically in his battle with cancer for more than a year and a half. We wear t-shirts for him, emblazoned with the statement "Not All Superheroes Look The Same," words surrounded by 12 superhero masks, 11 black, and one yellow. The yellow one is for Jackson. We have prayed, given money, taken food, offered gift cards and prayed some more. We know some heroes in all of this, and they are Jackson, Holly, Dave and Scarlett.

Which brings me to this simple question: Why? Why did this happen to a boy, a kind and gentle human being, only 13? Don't tell me I cannot ask God "Why?" Job dealt with friends who tried to shush his bold inquiries, but Job would not be silent. He wanted to know about the death of his family. He screamed at the heavens in expectation of a reply! He got one, too, not the one he wanted, but more importantly, he got God Almighty, a Voice in a whirlwind. Ask your questions! Jesus did. So should we.

In her poem "Kindness" Naomi Shihab Nye writes, "Before you know what kindness really is/you must lose things/feel the future dissolve in a moment/like salt in a weakened broth." We know all too well what it is like to feel the future dissolve in a moment. Too much loss. Too much dissolved. Just too much. I need the kindness now, thank you very much.

I have to be honest. I am sick and tired of losing things, of burying people that I love and carrying around the sorrow from that loss. I grow weary of trite, simplistic faith statements that seek to suppress our lament, despair and anger. Give it to God, all of it, every shred of your shattered soul, in all of its honesty. And demand an answer! Beneath the crushing losses, way down at the bottom of things, there is kindness, the kindness of God, and friends who understand the valley of the shadow of death, people who have walked that way and come out the other side. Kindness rises out of deep loss. The cost is great. The gift is greater.


Primetimers Plus- First Monday Luncheon




Food Pantry- Come lend a hand!
