From the Preacherman....

The foremost song of Advent begins with the line *O come*, *O come*, *Emmanuel*, *and ransom captive Israel*, *that mourns in lonely exile here*, *until the Son of God appear*. These words can be traced to a prayer for deliverance written during the fearful years of the late 5th or early 6th century A.D. when barbarians were finishing off what was left of the Roman Empire. It was the end of the world, a civilization that people had known for a thousand years. The prayer of the lonely soul, longing for Emmanuel to come, resonates still after fifteen centuries.

In the midst of the American holiday season, its relentless good cheer and upbeat songs building to the emotional frenzy of Christmas Day, a prayer of lament seems out of place. In fact, if you go on too long in this manner, people will tune you out. You will be labeled Scrooge or a Grinch and accused of trying to ruin Christmas for everyone. The tyranny of optimism that descends on our country in December is suffocating and unyielding. There is no room in the inn for lament, mourning or grief. It's Christmas! Be happy!

Advent and the Christian faith offer something different. Martin L. Smith writes, "Hope has nothing in common with optimism, a cheap, over-the-counter drug for maintaining denial. Hope is not only compatible with, but actually requires, a courageous facing of death and vulnerability." This is the true meaning of Christmas that Advent seeks to instill within us, a courageous, honest and therefore hopeful facing of life's realities. God sent Jesus, not because everything was fine and wonderful, but because the world is desperately lost in despair, hopelessness and death.

Therefore, every year during December, I find myself urging people to go visit a loved one in a cemetery or take some time with an old photo album or meander in the woods on a long walk letting the deepest pains and sorrows of the soul rise up in protest and grief. Leave the false optimism behind and cry out for Emmanuel to come and ransom us from lonely exile here. For those who struggle during this season with grief from loss, the vulnerability of life in these fragile bodies, or the slow, painful death of a loved one, hear the Good News. Christmas is for you. Christmas is God's embrace of suffering humanity in mortal flesh so that the world may be redeemed, saved, lifted up and made new.

The only way to get to the real joy of Christmas is through the dark night of the soul. *O come*, *O come*, *Emmanuel* is the faithful prayer of all of us who need God's help. The refrain sings our hope: *Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee*, *O Israel!* For all who suffer this year, let it be so. Amen.


