From the Preacherman....

The last guarter of the year is always frenetic. Holidays and holy days draw near. Days grow shorter as seasons change. Plants and people prepare for the long, cold days ahead. Much must be done in little time. We cram an awful lot of busyness into the last three months. On September 25 it was three months until Christmas!

The church is the same. We need many things from you in a short amount of time. We need to hear from you about people who might consider serving as Elders or Deacons. We need to hear if you are interested in serving on a committee, as a chairperson or member. We will be asking you to consider what you can give financially to support the work and ministry of this church in 2022. We need to know if you can teach Sunday School or help with Worship and Wonder.

People may think, well, someone will take care of that. Someone else will do it. I'm too busy to help, too tired to do anything, too worn out to worry about things others will do. Well, maybe not. We are all busy, tired and worn out. The last 18 months have been brutally difficult. Everyone has struggled with pandemic, not just a few people. Everyone has. Your pastor has, I know that. You need to know that the future in the church does not look like the past. I am hopeful, but also realistic. Some ministries or projects will never start back. Some ministries will begin again because people care enough to see that it continues. But some won't.

And yet, from those ashes came this church, no, not the building, but you, all of you, who struggled and suffered and decided it was important to stay through the worst days in order to see better days.

Better days than these will come. That, I believe. How can you serve in the mean time? And yes, it is a mean time, but God and God's people are tougher than the meanest days. You and your skills and abilities are needed here. The virus will end. God's people will not.

First Christian Church has volunteered to provide household items needed to set up apartments for the incoming refugees. Listed below are items that the new arrivals usually need. Other churches/agencies have signed up for toiletries, cleaning supplies, furniture, and coats; however, if you have a heavy, gently worn winter coat (children's, women's, men's) that you would be willing to donate, the International Center would welcome it. The largest size they typically need is an adult medium. In order to better space out the items needed, there will be 2 rounds of donations:

- Forks, knives, spoon sets
- Dish sets

- Chef knife

- Sink strainer
