From the Preacherman....

Christmas is music. Whatever else you can say about the season- the gifts, Santa Claus, family, the birth of Jesus- it is most certainly about songs. Does anyone go caroling on Valentine's Day? Gather for singing on Memorial Day? Sing any Thanksgiving songs recently? Easter has lots of songs, but radio stations don't play Easter music for a month. Independence Day? Maybe, if you are into marches and such. Even our birthdays only get a single tune, and it isn't very complicated or fancy.

But Christmas? The season is inseparably intertwined with songs. Hundreds of them, maybe thousands. There are so many great secular songs we can scarcely name them: "I'll Be Home for Christmas" or "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer" just to name two. The sheer number of religious tunes is astounding. We can hum the melodies if nothing else

Why is this so? For lack of a better phrase, music is time-travel. No matter the song or tune, we are often transported to another place and time when we hear the familiar. I have songs I heard at 16, driving around Eastman, Georgia in 1982, songs that evoke that very place and time in my life, right down to the smells of the air and the gnats in my mouth. Music does that to us, inviting us into a world that isn't past at all. (h/t William Faulkner)

Also, music touches us in deep places emotionally, places that evoke feelings we don't even know. The Apostle Paul calls this "sighs too deep for words" in Romans 8. The words and the music we sing and hear at Christmas are evocative, as if we are haunted by the presence of another that we cannot quite touch or see.

In this spirit, my sermons in Advent and Christmas will arise from the songs we sing: "O Come, O Come Emmanuel;" "O Little Town of Bethlehem;" "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day;" "Away in a Manger;" "Silent Night" and "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing." Even if some of the words aren't quite recalled, you are already humming the tunes, your souls moving across miles and years to a place you remember but haven't yet visited. Yes, that place, deep down at the foundations of the world. Listen and watch. Christmas is coming, wafting in on the wind. "You better watch out, you better not cry, you better not pout, I'm telling you why...."
