From the Preacherman....

When I was younger, much younger, I thought I knew the meaning of Christmas. It was about gifts, right? You know the gifts we buy for others and the cookies we bake for friends and yes, the gift of baby Jesus in the manger. Ok, but If I am honest, truly honest, it was all about the gifts I was going to receive. I marked the pages in the toy catalogues for my parents so they would know exactly what to tell Santa to put in my stocking on Christmas morning and under the tree and at my grandparents' house later. What am I getting? I really needed to know!

What is amazing now is what I remember. I remember the Christmas when my dad was in seminary and my brothers and I got multiple model airplanes to build and paint and hang from the ceiling in our bedroom. Odd, isn't it, that the Christmas that first springs to mind was the most tenuous of my parents' young life together. They were hundreds of miles from home and family, working part-time jobs, based on something as tenuous as my father's call to ministry. However, the struggle makes my memory clearer. It is not unconfined joy, but the sharp ache that I remember.

Now, I pay attention to the ache, the longing, the hope for fulfillment. What I know now is that the season is about waiting, anticipation and the excitement that somehow slows time to a crawl so that Christmas seems to move with the swiftness of a sloth. I am so grateful as an adult to revere the season of Advent in preparation for Christmas and to actually celebrate the full 12 days of Christmas from December 25 to January 5. The seasons give the days room to breathe, time is given space to dawdle.

As a boy I remember my grandfather Michael putting lights on the giant holly tree beside the front door of his house. The tree was fifteen or twenty feet tall, huge at the base, with sharp leaves that pricked a child's hands when stringing the lights. And such lights! They were huge, thumb-sized bulbs in brilliant colors. They seemed visible for miles, or at least they did to me as I stood in the dark amazed.

What I remember most, however, is the quiet, the stillness, the hint of a promise of something coming, something unexpected and untamed. That is what I remember most and what I long for now, not gifts or presents, but PRESENCE, God's presence in this world, the true gift of Christmas. We have to pay attention, to listen and watch and smell and taste for the One who moves among us. Advent and Christmas urge us to calmness and silence and stillness, both with our memories and our hopes for days to come.

The culture around us will be loud and boisterous, but pay attention to the silence. Look and listen and watch. Christmas is coming. Christmas is here.




Captain Duane Harper, with the Daviess County Sherriff's Department has enjoyed his new 'gig', working security at our Church on Wednesdays.
