## *From the Preacher....*

Words and phrases have lovely, odd, and curious meanings. "In the meantime" is a phrase that indicates an action that will occur while or before another action occurs: "I will read this article soon, but, in the meantime, I will make some tea." There is another sense of the phrase, however—one that emphasizes a very different definition.

We seem to be living in the meantime, or mean-time, a time in which we are callous with one another, fearful of things near and far, afraid of our neighbors who look different and believe different things. As the world has shrunk through various means of communication, our fears have grown, empowered by technology that invites us to see caricatures, not real people. Humans have always been tribal beings, noting "them" and "us" and highlighting differences that some think should be limited or eliminated.

I am a child of the 20th Century, so I know what I am saying. Hundreds of millions of people died in wars and genocidal murder on an awful scale on every part of our planet. People dehumanized tribes and nationalities and skin colors and ethnicities in an attempt to cleanse us of differences. The 20th Century learned from the 19th and has taught well the 21st. Things aren't exactly improving, eh?

I hear people say that if we could just get back to the way things used to be, all would be well. But when exactly was that? Before marriage equality? Civil rights? Voting rights for women? Before the Civil War and the end of slavery? The earliest stories in Genesis speak a truth we don't want to accept. Humanity has in its heart a willingness to defy God and murder our brothers and sisters. So, go back to when?

Long ago I learned a valuable lesson: a white American male pays less rent than almost anyone else in my country. What does that mean? It means that people see my gender and ethnicity before anything else and treat me kindly for it. Or judge me badly. People of different genders and skin colors and languages and sexuality and ethnicities pay more rent; they are judged differently and with greater prejudice than I am.

Jesus calls me to see the world in his own way, to treat people and this planet from a completely different perspective. He calls me to love my neighbor. Period. And he doesn't care who my neighbor is, who they voted for, or what team is their favorite. Jesus said to love them. He died believing that. It kind of matters.

Lent draws near, with Ash Wednesday on February 18. I have many sins for which I need to repent and receive forgiveness. We all do.


