From the Preacherman....

It happened at an Elders meeting early on a Sunday morning twenty years ago. I was the pastor of Cherry Log Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the mountains of North Georgia. Judy Hardy was the elder in charge of the short devotion and prayer at the start of the meeting. The plan had been the same for countless meetings I have attended over the years as a pastor of 5 churches. But this one was different.

Judy's prayers were always memorable, poetic, moving and personal. On this day, however, she asked permission to share a prayer a friend had brought to her attention. She pulled out a weathered photocopy and began to read. In that moment I knew, I knew, that this prayer, attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, would be with me for the rest of my days. After memorizing it, a few weeks later I pronounced the prayer as a benediction for my congregation at the conclusion of worship. And it was just right.

Benedictions are difficult. People are ready to leave, checking their watches, shuffling their feet. There are passages of Scripture to say, short prayers to memorize or perhaps something new every week. They all felt strained to me, kind of important, but really just a way to say, "That's it. We are done. See ya!" So, I kept casting about, searching for just the right thing.

And there it was: A benediction asking for God to bless us with discomfort, anger, tears and foolishness, a clarion call to go and live differently than every other way the world calls good and important. It was an entreaty to see and find God in the midst of struggle and pain and suffering, all the places that Jesus showed up to reveal divine presence in the midst of the world at its worst. It is a prayer with meat on its bones, one that will stay with you in the dark night of your own souls. It pleases me deeply to see people whispering the words as I say the prayer aloud on Sundays.

And so, now I leave it here with you, to take with you whenever you may need it....

May God bless you with Discomfort... at Easy Answers, Half-Truths, and Superficial Relationships, so that you may live Deep Within Your Heart. May God bless you with Anger... at Injustice, Oppression, and Exploitation of People, so that you may work for Justice, Freedom, and Peace. May God bless you with Tears... to shed for those who suffer from Pain, Rejection, Starvation, and War, So that You may reach out Your Hand to Comfort them and to turn their Sorrow into Joy. And may God bless you with enough foolishness... to Believe that You can Make a Difference in this World, and DO those things others claim cannot be Done.

This non-profit offers several services to people experiencing homelessness and addiction including temporary housing, classes and meals that the community can "purchase" with credits earned from attending classes. Room In the Inn has locations all around the US. The mission of RITI is, "To provide programs that emphasize human development and recovery through education, self-help and work, centered in community and long term support for those who call the streets of Nashville home." The CYF served breakfast and lunch to attendees and helped sort donations.
