From the Preacherman...

Christianity is about conversion. Whatever else you may want to say about the Way of Jesus, you must include in the definition the basic truth that the Christian faith is about a change of mind and life. I discovered very early in my ministry that if I was going to be faithful to my calling as a preacherman, then I would have to preach for change and conversion in the lives of individuals and the church.

However, an emphasis on conversion does not necessarily mean a weekly call to the altar to repent and rededicate one's life to God. To stress change does not imply constant turmoil or disorder. The sudden conversion of Saul on the Road to Damascus is but one of many conversion stories in the Book of Acts, and Luke does not make any one of them into the model for coming to faith in Jesus. Conversion to faith in Christ is a process developing slowly over time with periods of intensity and passion.

Over the past few Sundays I have been preaching from stories of conversion in Acts. Those stories shed light on the question "How are we becoming Christian?" I choose the word "becoming" on purpose. It implies that faith has a definite starting point and direction but is never finished or fulfilled in this lifetime. In other words, we are never fully Christian, only becoming more and more like the One we seek to follow as disciples.

I also chose to use the plural pronoun "we" because salvation in Jesus Christ is never a solitary process. Our culture celebrates individual striving and achievement, but Jesus calls people into relationships and community. No one can be a Christian all alone. Other people convert us to faith in Jesus. I sometimes wish that this was not so because it means we need each other, even when we annoy and infuriate one other, maybe especially then. I sometimes think that the church is God's wacky science experiment in which strange ingredients (us) are mixed together in odd circumstances just to see what will happen.

I really don't understand how we all got here and I am not really sure what God is up to, but that was the story in the early church as well. We are being changed daily into something that more closely resembles the dying and resurrected body of Christ. That is a little exciting and a lot scary, but it seems to be how God makes Christians.
