From the Preacherman....

I am watching in wonder as a woodpecker inches its way around a tree in my front yard, tap-tap-tapping the trunk in search of dinner. The tree itself is bursting with new growth, buds and tiny leaves. Daffodils and tulips declare their presence, shouting with brilliant colors where not long ago snow and ice ruled with an iron fist. Now, nature loses all control in my yard. I sit in silent reverie.

Something in this stirs me to confess a deeply held truth: God is wasteful, careless and wild in the ways of this world. In particular, God is heedless and profligate in the showing of love for human beings great and small. Jesus was such a gift. God wastes so much time and energy every day to bless my life with such astonishing signs. No, not money and things, but people and nature and friends and food and sentences. Yes, even sentences. Surprised?

The wastefulness of God goes against the dominant belief in our time. Our culture values efficiency, timeliness, and bottom-line thinking. Just the facts, ma'am, said Joe Friday, and we confess to supporting such nonsense. We have less room and little value for stories and poems and beauty and quiet, aimless conversations. Such things are supposedly of little value and barely important in the "real world." They are, however, the things that matter most, all that really count. Why do we dismiss them?

I have two paintings by CW Conner, an artist from Georgia, in my study at church. One is a scene of a revival service and the other the Last Supper of Jesus. His perspective in painting is immediately noticeable, but something more elemental is also present. CW painted on pieces of old wood, discarded tin and unused shingles that he found. He often took what amounted to trash and painted on it brilliant scenes in a distinctive style. The glory of God's presence shines out of a folk-artist's discovered canvas.

So, when I notice a friend's dogwood blooms on a broken limb in her home, the flowers still shining brightly, I pay attention. My wife's orchids blooming in full glory announce their presence daily in my den. Birds gather sticks in my yard for sturdily built nests awaiting new life. In things great and small God's presence announces itself.

At the grocery recently I watched children gaze in wonder at the gum/toy/candy dispensers in the front of the store, then scurry quickly to mom with outstretched hands. "Please, please!" they begged as she slowly dropped coins into their palms. I smiled as I passed them squealing with delight, remembering such days long ago. I have made so many errors and mistakes in my life, committed so many sins, and yet the glory of God abounds all around me, offered as gifts to an open heart, if I will simply see and accept and wonder. What are you waiting for? Let God in.
