From the Preacherman....

I know a lot (and I mean a lot) of people don't care about this, but college football season has started, and few things excite me as much. For many people that is not the case, and I get it, but for me, not many things thrill me as much as the start of football season.

It could be because of the places I have lived. My brother Sean and I filmed games when we were in high school in Eastman, Georgia. I went to college in Athens, Georgia, where football is more religion than mere sporting event. I followed football, high school and college, wherever I have lived, be it Louisville, Kentucky or Elberton, Georgia or Narrows, Virginia or Ellijay, Georgia. In some of those places teams won state championships, a truly remarkable experience. To move to Valdosta, Georgia was a special treat, given that the high school stadiums in South Georgia are bigger than some colleges, and the history richer. Owensboro offers its own deep tradition of football. It matters here.

It could be that I enjoy football season because of the people I meet and the experiences I have at games. Tailgating before and after games, watching on television to see my children in the crowd, the astonishing exhilaration of big wins and the absolute deflation of close losses are experiences that cannot be matched, anywhere, anyplace or anytime. I wouldn't trade those encounters for anything in the world.

However, if I am honest, the ultimate reason I care so much about football has to do with my parents. I remember standing on the sidelines with my father when he coached at Oconee County High School and watching them stop George Rogers of Duluth on the goal line for four straight plays. I remember my mother painting our faces before high school games in Simpsonville, South Carolina. I remember hunkering down by a radio in 1978 straining to hear Larry Munson's call on a cold October night in Lexington, Kentucky. And I remember the last autumn my father and I shared, talking about Georgia football until he talked no more.

I remember and care because the people who were closest to me also cared and passed along their passion and deeply held convictions, not merely with words, but with deeds and actions and in ways I can scarcely name. People like that also passed along their faith, living it out so gently and plainly that it seemed as simple as drinking water from a dipper, cold and clear, washing away everything else that seemed important.

Some things matter. Some things really matter. My family and my faith taught me things that really matter. May yours do so as well.
