#### From the Preacherman....

Early one morning last week I poured a cup of coffee and glanced out the kitchen window. There in the birdbath, hunkered down low, with only its head above the water, was a hawk. A hawk was in our birdbath. Splashing about, leisurely cleaning its feathers, the hawk had the run of the place. Nothing else was moving. Nothing. No birds were anywhere to be seen. Two squirrels crouched in the side of the yard, frozen in place. The rabbits all were hiding. From its watery throne the hawk reigned supreme for maybe ten minutes, then flew up to a tree to dry its feathers. The yard began to come to life again.

As my heart started to beat normally, I noticed a few things. For ten minutes I stood looking at the hawk and never took a picture with my phone. My kids are laughing at me for that. Is that a generational thing? Perhaps. Will I miss not having a picture later? Maybe. Was I fully in the moment as I watched? Absolutely. It is learned behavior practiced for years.

I remember deer hunting once in woods near my parent's home. Squirrels chattered, birds chirped and chipmunks rattled through the leaves. Then, the woods grew still, silent. An owl softly hooted and swooped silently by my head, landing in a tree nearby. Nothing moved, not a sound was made. The owl hooted again as it scanned the forest floor. After a few minutes it flew away. The forest gave a soft sigh as it breathed again. I learned to listen and pay attention in the woods.

I also learned it in church, a place that asked me to be guiet and to pay attention, learned behavior that, if practiced over years, becomes a way of living in this world. "Be still and know that I am God," says the psalmist. Watch and listen for the God who is present but whose presence we often miss because we are too busy. I hear all the excuses about busyness. We need to learn to multitask! Or maybe we just need to learn to task, because our lack of attention is deadly.

The question these days to the preacher is often desperate: is there any word from the Lord? I am grateful for that inquiry, truly I am. But the bigger question may be this: am I really paying attention? I often wonder if Moses was the only person who saw the burning bush or was he simply the only one paying attention? People tell me weird stuff happens at my house. Maybe, I mean, who has bees in their wall, and now a hawk in the birdbath? Or perhaps the presence of God is all around us. 
## <u> Thank you- from Anne Carlisle</u>
